Core Activities (#1-4)

Focus: Program of Study Development of an integrated and articulated program of study between high school/K-12-higher education-workforce/industry.

- Design and/or revise secondary and postsecondary programs of study and degree plans that include: A-G requirements, 12 postsecondary credits, Full access advanced/weighted options (early and middle college, AP, IB, CTE.)
- Design maps that illustrate how students will progress through courses and pathways that lead to a range of postsecondary options and outcomes: Engineering, Health Care, Transportation, Computer Science, and Digital Media maps
- Design agreements services and structures that enable students to navigate transitions between institutions: Dual enrollment agreements, Integrated support services
- Examine the historical progress and outcomes associated with pre-existing pathways in the school to determine potential barriers and accelerants to success: Data analysis (with district) on student secondary outcomes, post-secondary outcomes for pre-existing pathways at schools sites (e.g. Engineering, Health Care, Transportation, Computer Science, and Digital Media).



Core Activities (#5-6)

Focus: Work-based Learning

Development of a

- Design and/or revise pathway industry-aligned, work-based learning continuums.
- Identify the technical and employability skills that align with classroom learning.



Core Activities (#7-9)

Focus: Integrated Student Supports

Identifying and compiling life and academic supports needed for all students to be able to participate in the program of study and work- based learning continuum

- Support for college and career counseling to expose students to a variety of high-quality postsecondary and career options, including those free from admissions requirements.
- Support to identify and implement meaningful monitoring and intervention plans that result in successful student transitions from K-12 to post-secondary education and/or work.
- Support to design achievement plans for English Language Learners, students with disabilities, and first-generation college students.



Core Activities (#10-13)

Focus: Regional Ecosystem

Designing a regional ecosystem of networks among K-12/higher education and industry partners that will support the students in pathways academically, socialemotionally, and in work-based learning continuum.

- Monthly check-ins/PD support with GS
 Pathways District/school designated staff for each of the participating schools to build leadership, learning, and networks among the designated staff.
- Support to engage secondary and postsecondary education, employers, workforce development, local government, economic development, Chambers of Commerce, industry associations, labor unions, and community-based organizations in the design and implementation of pathways.
- Support to use regional labor market information and employer input to identify growing industries and occupations, as well as the skills and credentials needed for a career in targeted industry sectors
- Support to reverse map a talent pipeline.



Core Activities (#14-15)

Focus: Sustainability and Coherence

Attending to the systems and processes that need to be in place to ensure that I-IV above can be sustained after the award period, by the school-community and district.
